

SC's observation in Lakhimpur Kheri case makes it clear independent probe needed: Priyanka

NEW DELHI, Nov 8 /--/ Buoyed by the Supreme Court's observation in the Lakhimpur Kheri case, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Monday said it is clear that an independent investigation is necessary for justice, and alleged that the Uttar Pradesh government is standing with those who trampled upon farmers.



The Congress leader's remarks came soon after the apex court suggested that a former High Court judge monitor the ongoing probe into the October 3 Lakhimpur Kheri incident. "In the Lakhimpur massacre case, it is clear that the Uttar Pradesh government is standing with those who trampled upon the farmers," Priyanka said in a tweet in Hindi. "The father of the person who is the main accused in trampling upon the farmers (Minister of State

for Home) has the protection of @narendramodi ji. It is clear from the observation of the Hon'ble Supreme Court that there should be an independent inquiry for justice (to be achieved)," the Congress general secretary said.

Priyanka, who was detained and arrested while on way to meet families of farmers killed in the incident, soon became more visible than any other opposition politician in Uttar Pradesh ahead of the upcoming Assembly elections in the state. There were quick comparisons of a similar act 44 years back by her grandmother Indira Gandhi, who had in 1977

visited Belchi in Bihar after the massacre of 13 people including 8 dalits by upper caste landowners. Indira's Belchi visit, which included a tractor ride and also an elephant ride due to the region's inaccessibility in the rainy season, is said to be one of the reasons that won her the spotlight as she eventually regained power in 1980.

While Congress workers love to draw the Indira analogy everytime Priyanka takes centre stage, political observers have been debating if Lakhimpur Kheri might become a springboard for Priyanka in UP in view of her aggressive approach during her visit to

Lakhimpur Kheri. A video went viral showing an angry Priyanka in a heated argument with Uttar Pradesh policemen who were trying to stop her at Sitapur. In July 2019, some months after she was handed over the charge of Uttar Pradesh, Priyanka was detained while she was on her way to meet families of victims of the Sonbhadra firing incident. She was kept overnight in a guesthouse in Mirzapur where members of two families met her. The Hathras incident again saw a flash of aggression by the Gandhi siblings when Priyanka and Rahul confronted cops on the Greater Noida expressway. (PTI)

Cong questions 'secret deal' between Centre and Finmeccanica as ban on procurement from company lifted

NEW DELHI, NOV 8 /--/ The Congress on Monday demanded answers from the Centre over reports of the lifting of a ban on procurement from Finmeccanica company which had been dubbed as corrupt by ruling BJP leaders over the Agusta choppers deal.

The Opposition party claimed that a "fake bogey of corruption" was raised by the BJP over the buying of VVIP helicopters during UPA-II rule and asked if it was being given a quiet burial. India had scrapped the contract with Finmeccanica's British subsidiary AgustaWestland in 2014 for supplying 12 AW-101 VVIP choppers to the Indian Air Force over alleged breach of contractual obligations and charges of kickbacks paid by the firm for securing the deal. The BJP had at that time attacked the Congress, asking if its leaders had received the alleged Rs 450 crore bribe money for the deal signed during the UPA-II government. Seeking to turn the tables, Congress chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala on Monday asked: "What is the 'secret deal' entered into between Modi Government and Agusta/Finmeccanica? Is it now ok to deal with a company that Modi ji and his government called 'corrupt-bribe-giver-bogus'?" "Does it mean that fake bogey of corruption is being given a quiet burial? The nation awaits answers," Surjewala said in a series of tweets. He cited media reports that the Modi government was lifting the ban on procurement from Finmeccanica. "The PM called the company 'corrupt'. HM called the company 'bogus'. Ex Defence Minister accused it of 'bribes and corruption' in Parliament. Then, Modi Government - withdrew blacklisting of Agusta/Finmeccanica on 22nd July 2014. Now, lifted procurement ban," he alleged in another tweet while citing the media report. Surjewala also alleged that the "friends of the media" spent thousands of hours of air time showing leaked documents by the Modi Government and building a "false narrative" against the UPA-Congress in the run up to 2014 Parliamentary elections. Continuance of courts virtually will be a problem: SC


NEW DELHI, NOV 8 /--/ Continuance of courts virtually will be a problem, the Supreme Court said on Monday while refusing to grant urgent hearing on a plea seeking that virtual court hearings be declared a fundamental right for litigants. A bench comprising Justices L Nageswara Rao and B R Gavai said there are many problems in virtual hearings. It will hear the matter in December. "Continuance of courts virtually would be a problem. We were doing 60-65 cases on a miscellaneous day earlier compared to 30-35 cases now despite the experience of over one year. There are many problems with virtual hearing. "We had senior advocates appearing in person in the Jarnail Singh (reservation in promotion) case where the lawyers said it feels so good to come here and argue physically. We are also opening up now. Let us open fully and then we will hear," the bench said.

Senior advocate Sidharth Luthra mentioned the matter and sought urgent hearing of the matter saying access to justice was being hampered. "Today the litigant sitting anywhere can see what is going on in the matter and how we are performing," he said. The apex court said for 70 years there was access to justice without any complaint and now there is a problem with physical hearing. (PTI)

Modi "destroyed" economy by demonetisation: Kharge

HYDERABAD, NOV 8 /--/ Senior Congress leader and Leader of the Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge on Monday alleged that Prime Minister Narendra Modi "destroyed" India's economy through demonetisation.

"Today it is five years since Modi ji announced demonetisation on November 8, 2016. Unemployment has risen, small businesses have been hit and closed. He (Modi) spoiled the country's good economy through demonetisation," Kharge told newsmen. On this day in 2016, the Prime Minister had announced the decision to ban currency notes in the denomination of Rs 500 and Rs 1,000. The veteran leader also hit out at the Modi government over the various objectives cited for demonetisation, including to curb black money flow. "Today the situation is that people who lost their jobs due to demonetisation their jobs have not come back. This is a 'Black Day' for people of the country. Today the currency notes in circulation continue to rise with over Rs 28 lakh crore," the former Union minister said. On former Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) Vinod Rai, who recently tendered an apology to Congress leader



Sanjay Nirupam, Kharge said it vindicated the Congress consistent stand that the entire 2G spectrum case was a massive "conspiracy" backed by the BJP-RSS machinery to destabilise the (then) Manmohan Singh-led UPA government. Rai had tendered an unconditional apology to Nirupam for "wrongly mentioning him as one of the MPs who had pressured him not to name former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh in the CAG report on the 2G spectrum allocation. Kharge accused Rai of acting as another puppet of the conspiracy and also demanded that he apologise for the nation for his "lies". He also slammed the BJP-led NDA government over the "small" reduction in petrol and diesel prices, saying "it was too little and too late will not benefit the people much. (PTI)

CRPF jawan shoots dead 4 colleagues with AK-47 in Chhattisgarh's Sukma

SUKMA, NOV 8 /--/ Four CRPF jawans were killed and three others injured after their colleague opened fire at them in a camp of the paramilitary force in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district on Monday, a police official said.

Chief minister Bhupesh Baghel expressed grief over the incident and directed police officers to take necessary measures to ensure such incidents do not recur, according to a government statement. The incident took place at around 3.15 am in the camp of the Central Reserve Police Force's (CRPF) 50th battalion in Lingapalli village under Maraguda police station of the area of the district, located nearly 400 km from the state capital Raipur, Inspector General of Police (Bastar range) Sundarraj P said.

As per preliminary information, constable Reethesh Ranjan fired at his colleagues with his service

weapon, an AK-47 rifle, the official said. The seven injured jawans were immediately shifted to a hospital in nearby Bhadrachalam area of neighbouring Telangana, where doctors declared four of them dead on arrival, the official said. Those killed were identified as constables Rajmani Kumar Yadav, Rajib Mondal, Dhanji and Dharmendra Kumar, he said, adding that three other injured personnel were being treated at the hospital. The motive behind the firing is yet to be ascertained and an investigation is on into the incident, the official said.

Constable Ranjan was immediately held and his interrogation is underway, he said. Sukma superintendent of police Sunil Sharma told news agency PTI that Ranjan was scheduled to be on sentry duty at the camp from 4 am and after getting ready for it, he allegedly opened fire at his colleagues who were sleeping in a barrack. Around 40

to 45 jawans were sleeping inside the barrack at that time. After all the bullets in Ranjan's rifle got exhausted, he was overpowered and captured by some of his colleagues who woke up on hearing the sound of gun shots," the official said. As per preliminary information, Ranjan and the victims had been exchanging jokes and teasing each other for last two-three days. The accused might have been offended with the teasing and hence, took such a step, Sharma said. However, the exact motive behind the incident will be known after an investigation, he said. Two of the three injured jawans were being airlifted to Raipur for further medical assistance, while another jawan was undergoing treatment at Bhadrachalam, a statement from the Chhattisgarh government said. Of the deceased jawans, three belonged to Bihar and one was from West Bengal, it said. (PTI)

Indian Ocean Region to face ever-increasing battery of threats and uncertainties: Shringla

PANAJI, NOV 8 /--/ The Indian Ocean Region (IOR) will face an ever-increasing battery of threats and uncertainties, foreign secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla said on Monday.

Addressing the Goa Maritime Conclave on "Maritime security and emerging non-traditional threats: A case for proactive role for Indian Ocean Region navies", he also spoke of challenges arising from geopolitical volatilities. A lack of commitment to settled international law has led to an increased militarisation of the region, he said. Militarisation always adds to complexities, he added. The IOR, it is quite obvious, will face an increasingly complicated, rapidly evolving, and more demanding security situation, with an ever-increasing battery of threats and uncertainties, Shringla said. This requires all of us, and in particular the navies, the coast guards and the maritime security agencies of this region, to do more together, he said.

India stands ready and willing to do its share and more in tackling these problems, the bureaucrat added. The conclave was organised by the Naval War College in Goa. Security in the context of foreign policy or diplomacy has traditionally been associated

with countering external security threats - primarily military. Historically, diplomatic efforts to improve security have been about negotiating security alliances, Shringla said. We now operate on the basis of an expanded concept of human security that takes a broader view, he said. We are in the process of devising a new set of measures and arrangements that reflect this understanding of security. They are based less on the traditional concept of a military alliance and more on a cooperative approach, on prevention, on sharing of information, and, on promoting inter-operability across state borders, he said.

Many of these cooperative activities that we undertake are in the policing and law-enforcement spheres, Shringla said. It is my belief that these measures are more appropriate to the newer and rapidly evolving threat matrix that we are confronted with, the foreign secretary added. Referring to the IOR countries, he said we also inhabit a particular contemporary geopolitical and geoeconomics reality. We are a part of the greater Indo-Pacific space. This is a construct that has, for a very good reason, attracted much diplomatic and strategic attention, he added. (PTI)

Will never take any decision that may harm safety of Mullaperiyar Dam: Kerala govt

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, NOV 8 /--/ The Kerala government on Monday made it clear that it would never take any decision that could jeopardise the safety of Mullaperiyar Dam and harm the security of the people of the state, even as Opposition UDF blasted them in the Assembly over a controversial order permitting Tamil Nadu for felling 15 trees downstream of Baby Dam at Mullaperiyar reservoir.

"Safety for Kerala and water for Tamil Nadu" is the state government's proclaimed policy in the Mullaperiyar issue and there would be no deviation from the stand, the government told the House. The Congress-led Opposition pointed out that the order,

issued by the principal chief conservator of forests (wildlife) and chief wildlife warden on November 5, was the violation of the stand adopted by the state in the Mullaperiyar issue so far. However, the government assured that there is no question of taking any action against the interests of the state and said its strong position in the issue was made clear in the note and reply affidavit filed in the apex court regarding the Mullaperiyar case.

The Pinarayi Vijayan government's explanation came a day after it was forced to freeze an order, issued by the principal chief conservator of forests (wildlife) and chief wildlife warden granting permission to

Tamil Nadu for felling 15 trees downstream of Baby Dam at Mullaperiyar reservoir, in the wake of huge political controversy erupted in the southern state. While replying to a notice seeking an adjournment motion over the issue, forest minister A K Saseendran said the government would never accept the bureaucratic decision taken against the interests of the state in this regard. The chief executive engineer of the Tamil Nadu Water Resources Department had sought permission to cut 23 trees from near the Baby Dam site, he said.
